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Introduction

The world faces significant challenges in creating educational systems that are equitable, inclusive, high-quality, and relevant. Hundreds of millions of people, particularly in low- and middle-income countries, still lack access to quality, fair, and equitable education. This issue has been worsened by ongoing political, economic, social, and climate crises, including pandemics, wars, and natural disasters. These crises have profoundly affected the education sector, resulting in setbacks in achieving the fourth Sustainable Development Goal (SDG4).

Additionally, there is a widening gap between educational outcomes and the labor market, as well as the demands and challenges of life in a rapidly changing world. This gap is particularly evident in fields undergoing major and accelerated transformations, such as information and communication technology and artificial intelligence.

To advance education and elevate its status as a powerful driving force for our shared future, as well as a foundation for peace, tolerance, human rights, and sustainable development, there is an urgent need to transform education. This entails reimagining and reshaping education to build a brighter and more distinguished future. Furthermore, there is a need to renew international political and financial commitments to education, recognizing it as a global public good.

In response to this need, the global community convened the Transforming Education Summit (TES) at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from September 17 to 19, 2022. This summit marked an unprecedented milestone in the global education journey, focusing on formulating a Global Compact for Transforming Education supported by national commitment documents, in which each country, including most ICESCO Member States, outlined the policies and measures they intend to implement across various pathways for transforming education, as stipulated in the summit's reference documents. At this stage, the critical task is to actualize the vision of transforming education and fulfill commitments through the implementation of best practices. In this regard, the Islamic World Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (ICESCO), in line with its mission, responsibility, and new vision, and in cooperation with the Ministry of Education of Sultanate Oman, plans to organize the third Conference of Ministers of Education under the theme "Transforming Education: from Commitment to Practice," in Muscat, the Sultanate of Oman, from October 2 to 3, 2024. have mobilized The organizers decision-makers from the Member States, alongside the UN System Organizations, relevant international and regional organizations, civil society organizations, youth and women, activists and influencers, the private sector, donors, and funding entities, among others.

Conference Objectives

- Ensuring the renewal of commitment, readiness, and preparedness of the Member States to fulfill their commitments towards transforming education through effective practices.
- 2. Establishing effective mechanisms to disseminate best practices that have proven successful in accelerating the implementation of commitments across various aspects of transforming education.
- **3. Encouraging and facilitating cooperation** among the Member States in transforming education and supporting their joint action programs.

- **4. Building a strong network of multi-dimensional** coalitions and partnerships that also include various funding and donor entities.
- 5. Developing effective mechanisms to monitor the implementation of the outcomes of the Transforming Education Summit in the Member States.
- 6. Introducing a multi-dimensional program to support the efforts of less fortunate countries in their pursuit of transforming education.
- 7. Highlighting the ethical and moral references of the various contents of education transformation within the civilizational heritage of the Islamic world.



The Conference will culminate in the Muscat Declaration on Transforming Education in the Islamic World

Conference organization

Sessions will be allocated to give heads of delegations the opportunity to deliver their countries' statements regarding the Conference theme. Conference guests will also have the opportunity to present their statements in the sessions based on the nature of their contributions. ICESCO will present reports and documents, including a comprehensive analytical report on the efforts of the Member States in implementing their commitments to transform education into action. This report will highlight successes, innovations, challenges, and obstacles encountered.

The program will feature a special session dedicated to presenting the youth's forward-looking perspective on the future of education. The closing session will be reserved for the adoption of the Muscat Declaration, outlining the roadmap for implementing the outcomes of the Transforming Education Summit in the Member States, followed by the endorsement of the Conference recommendations.

Given the special nature of this Ministerial Conference, high-level scientific sessions have been organized, each addressing a specific topic from the education transformation agenda that is particularly relevant to ICESCO Member States. Each session will be organized in collaboration with prestigious global institutions specializing in the session's theme.

During these sessions, а select group of experts will deliver technical presentations, showcasing their outstanding contributions in the field, followed by discussions and opportunities for the Member States to share their most innovative and relevant initiatives related to the session's theme. Participation in these sessions will be both in-person and virtual, with live broadcasts, ICESCO will publish the proceedings of these sessions in a special report after the Conference concludes

- 1. Transforming Education in the Islamic World.
- 2. Greening Education.
- 3. The Role of Artificial Intelligence and Digital Transformation in Accelerating the Transformation of Education.
- 4. Education in Times of Crises and Emergencies.
