# Sowing the seeds of peace by mobilizing youth and women leaders

### **Background and Rationale**

Challenges to peace and security have multiplied in our world, hindering multiple efforts to achieve social and human development and build strong human capital. According to the Global Peace Index 2021, more than 60% of people worldwide fear serious harm from violent crime, while the economic impact of violence increased in 2020 to \$1496 trillion, equivalent to 11.6% of global GDP or \$1,942 per person due to increased military spending. According to the Global Peace Index 2024, the level of conflict increased worldwide in 2024 more than it was in 2008, making 2024 the least peaceful year since the launch of the report.

The context of the polycrisis in which we are living is worsening the security situation in many parts of the world, where climate change, food insecurity, poverty and other scourges were already fertile ground for violent extremism and other threats to peace. Yet, the several tools of peacebuilding such as mobilizing social actors for peace, promoting inter-religious and intercultural dialogue, building broad coalitions of peace entrepreneurs, training and education for peace, remain largely unexploited.

Building peace requires the training and mobilization of key social actors who can spearhead social transformation by working to create an environment that is more conducive to social cohesion. Young people and women leaders are of particular importance, because

of the central role they have to play in processes of social transformation, especially in peacebuilding, promoting dialogue and preventing violence and extremism.

There is therefore a need for programs that target potential or accomplished leaders and provide them with tools to engage their peers in the peacebuilding agenda. This training will equip them with the knowledge tools through a holistic approach to peace while strengthening their leadership to make them real agents of change at the community and global level. It will also leverage the power and reach of information technologies to bring together people from different cultures and backgrounds to engage and share a common journey of advocacy for peace and dialogue.

To cater to these needs, ICESCO has developed the Leadership Training in Peace and Security (LTIPS) program as part of its commitment through its policies, strategies and programs to promote and strengthen peace by adopting a holistic and multisectoral approach. The LTIPS program is in line with several other programs, such as the project on a Master in Artificial Intelligence Applied to Peace, the Capacity Building sessions at the ICESCO Regional Center for Education for the Culture of Peace in Yamoussoukro, Côte d'Ivoire, and the pilot project on the introduction of the Peace 360° approach in the curricula.







## The Leadership Training In Peace And Security (LTIPS) Program



#### **General** objective

The objective of LTIPS is to train and mobilize leaders who are agents of change for peace and dialogue to build the societies we want. It is about building a network of youth, women and religious leaders who are ambassadors for peace in their communities by providing them with knowledge and leadership tools, through interaction with inspiring leaders and expert trainers and supporting them in taking initiatives and projects for peace and social cohesion.



#### **Specific objectives**

- Prepare a critical mass of youth and women leaders for peace to become agents of change in their communities.
- Encourage and promote female leadership as an effective role model for building equal, inclusive and prosperous societies.
- Capitalize on the experience and the network of trainers developed by ICESCO's Regional Center for Education in the Culture of Peace (CRECP) to disseminate the knowledge that was built on a larger scale.
- To promote joint projects with ICESCO partners in the areas of peace and social cohesion.
- Promote innovation and creativity in peace and social cohesion projects, promoting the initiatives of youth, women and religious leaders.
- Build a global network of peace and intercultural dialogue entrepreneurs through learning and sharing experiences and building coalitions of actors for change.
- To publicize and promote among young people the work of leaders and personalities who are role models for peace, citizenship, social cohesion and dialogue among civilizations.
- To enable experts and researchers to share the results of their research with actors in the field to connect research and action.

#### **Targets**

The program will target youth and female leaders from around the world, with gender parity. These leaders will be selected from civil society and community-based organizations that have demonstrated a strong commitment to peace and a strong potential for social and community mobilization in the past.

### Projects and initiatives for peace and social cohesion

To enable the beneficiaries to put into practice the concepts and skills accumulated during the training, each of the trainees will submit a peace and social cohesion project and they will receive technical support during the incubation retreat as well as financial support and mentorship to implement the project. To encourage their creativity and foster their motivation, the most innovative projects will be specially rewarded.

• Celebration of the 20th Anniversary of the Afro-Arab Youth Council in Uganda

15 young ambassadors for peace took part in person from March 04 to 10, 2024 in the launch of the 2023-2024 edition of the LTIPS program in the Republic of Uganda during the celebration of the 20th anniversary of the Afro-Arabe Youth Council.

• International forum "By Youth For Youth" in Azerbaijan

The international forum "By Youth For Youth" held from 24 to 28 June 2024 in Baku and Shusha in the Republic of Azerbaijan was the culmination of the 2023-2024 edition of the LTIPS programme. It brought together about 100 youth peace ambassadors from 40 ICESCO member countries around four central themes: peace and well-being, climate change, entrepreneurship and cultural heritage. The forum was concluded with the development by the youth of a declaration entitled "Shusha Baku Youth Action Plan for a Sustainable Future in the Islamic World."

#### Mentoring for Peace from World Leaders

As an integral part of the programme, the Global Leaders for Peace Mentorship Framework provides a unique opportunity for intergenerational dialogue between former Heads of State and Government who have made an outstanding contribution to peace and social cohesion in their countries and around the world and the Youth Peace Ambassadors.

The mentorship of global peace leaders takes place through a series of face-to-face or virtual dialogues aimed at passing on the wealth of lessons and experiences on leadership for peace accumulated over the years by past presidents to new generations of young peace ambassadors.
